Culturally Belonging: Designing Innovation in Atlanthos

In 2024, Ethos Lab collaborated with MOA to create a new display called Culturally Belonging: Designing Innovation in Atlanthos Through Afrofuturistic Storytelling in the Multiversity Galleries. This worldbuilding project was driven by the creative minds of eleven teenagers who learned to ground their storytelling in African culture and history.

Taking inspiration from this project, the Designing Atlanthos: Artifacts of Innovation workshop explores the intersection of culture and STEAM. Students will design their own belongings inspired by knowledge gained from MOA's African collection. This workshop will be delivered by facilitators from Ethos Lab, a Black-led nonprofit innovation academy for youth in grades 5 to 12 based in Vancouver, British Columbia.

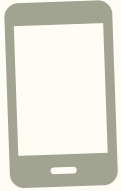
